## **What are the school hours of operation?**

Students may be dropped off at St. John's campus beginning at 7:30am. School runs from 7:55am to 2:30pm. St. Mary's campus beginning at 7:45am. School runs from 8:05am - 2:40pm

## **What are the hours of operation for Pre-K?**

Pre-K students (ages 3, 4 and 5) may enroll for 5 full days, 3 full days, or 5 half days. A full day is 8am - 2:40pm, a half day is 8am - noon. All students must be fully potty trained.

## **Do you offer before or after school child care?**

Yes! We do have an extended day program for a fee of \$6 an hour. Before school care is available at 7am. After school care is 2:30pm - 5:30pm. We also offer childcare on most holidays, snow days, and during school vacation weeks. Spots are limited. Registration is required. We also offer summer camps!

## **How do we order uniforms?**

Students have uniform options: formal, casual and gym class. Uniforms can be ordered through Flynn and O'Hara <https://flynnohara.com>. We also have a Uniform Shop with gently used items at our St. John's Campus (166 State St.). Please call to make an appointment 942-0955. Sometimes we have extra Pre-K size uniforms on hand to distribute. Please check with the childcare office.

## **Do you offer a bus?**

We have an Intercampus Bus that runs between our two buildings in the morning and in the afternoon.

## **What if my family is not Catholic?**

Rooted in the Catholic tradition, All Saints provides a strong academic curriculum intertwined with spiritual guidance in a welcoming environment for all families. We have many families of different Christian beliefs and other faiths. Currently, 73% of our student body is Catholic. All students are expected to participate in our religion classes and attend Mass weekly.

## **Do you have a lunch program?**

Yes! Hot lunches are provided by Fairmount Market for a nominal fee. Parents can select which days they'd like to order on a monthly basis. Students should bring a water bottle and a snack to school each day.

## **My child has allergies. Do you have a school nurse?**

Yes! We have a part-time school nurse who will work with you and our teachers to ensure your child's needs are met. Our teachers are trained to use Epi-Pens in the event of an emergency and many are also pediatric CPR certified.

## **How do you handle disciplinary issues?**

Our process is progressive and restorative. We follow a behavior rubric to guide teachers with action steps. This rubric can be found in our student policy handbook. We believe that all children are children of God and should be treated with love and respect.

## **Who can volunteer in the school?**

Our families make a commitment to serve 20 volunteer hours over the course of the year (10 community and 10 in fundraising). There are many ways to participate! Before one can volunteer, they must go through an application process, background check, and participate in a "Protecting God's Children" training session.

## **How diverse is the student body?**

Currently, based on data shared during enrollment, our student body is 88% white, 3%bi/multi-racial, 3% Black, 4% Asian, 1% American Indian and 1% unknown.

## **How much is tuition?**

PRE-K: Tuition for Pre-K students is based on days / times enrolled. The cost for a full day is \$40 a day; half day is \$25 a day. K-8: 2024-25 tuition rates: \$5200 for the first student for participating Catholic families. A discount is offered for families with multiple children. The 2024-25 tuition rate for Non Catholic families is \$7200 for the first child.

## **Do you offer financial aid?**

Yes! All Saints is committed to making Catholic education affordable for all families in the greater Bangor area. To the extent that our funds permit, assistance is available based on financial need and is determined through an evaluative process beginning with submitting an online application through our online system, FACTS. Applications are reviewed on a first come - first served basis. The deadline to apply is April 15, 2024.

## **How do I enroll?**

Families are asked to speak with the Admissions Coordinator and possibly set up a tour. Families will receive an email invitation with an application link. There is a \$25 application fee. Once you are invited to enroll, there is a non-refundable \$200 enrollment fee and other needed paperwork such as immunization records, previous school records if applicable, tuition payment agreement, and a copy of the child's birth certificate (for K students).

## **What else do we offer?**

We offer many extracurricular activities including ski club, robotics team, youth choir, mathcounts, chess club, and many seasonal sports such as soccer, basketball, wrestling, cheering, baseball, softball and track.
